## 4.G Swimming Pool Diving Boards

On Thursday, June 21, 2018, we had another reported injury at the Neodesha Splash Zone high-dive board. For this agenda item, Staff will present information to the Commission related to the diving boards at the Neodesha Splash Zone. Over the past eight-years, we have had five injuries related to the high-dive board, with most injuries occurring in the past three seasons. Staff will discuss the causes of those injuries, and possible actions to reduce/eliminate injuries. Actions could range from removal of the board, training for pool patrons, or stationing a lifeguard at the high-dive board to monitor patrons.

RECOMMENDED MOTION: I move to approve the removal of the high-dive board at the Neodesha Splash Zone, and to replace the board with a second low-diving board.

#### **ORDINANCE NO. 1697**

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING TRAFFIC WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF NEODESHA, KANSAS, INCORPORATING BY REFERENCE THE "STANDARD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE FOR KANSAS CITIES", EDITION OF 2018, WITH CERTAIN OMISSIONS, CHANGES AND ADDITIONS, PROVIDING CERTAIN PENALTIES AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 1666 AND ALL ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH.

#### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF NEODESHA, KANSAS:

STANDARD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE INCORPORATED. There is hereby incorporated by reference for the purpose of regulating traffic within the corporate limits of the City of Neodesha, Kansas that certain standard traffic ordinance known as the "Standard Traffic Ordinance for Kansas Cities", Edition of 2018, prepared and published in book form by the League of Kansas Municipalities, Topeka, Kansas, save and except such articles, sections, parts or portions as are hereafter omitted, deleted, modified or changed in Section 4 of this incorporating ordinance. Not less than three (3) copies of said Standard Traffic Ordinance shall be marked or stamped "Official Copy as Adopted by Ordinance No. 1697", with all sections or portions thereof intended to be omitted or changed clearly marked to show any such omission or change and to which shall be attached a copy of this ordinance, and filed with the City Clerk to be open to inspection and available to the public at all reasonable business hours. The Police Department, Municipal Judge, and all administrative departments of the City charged with enforcement of the ordinance shall be supplied, at the cost of the City, such number of official copies of such Standard Traffic Ordinance similarly marked, as may be deemed expedient.

#### Section 2 TRAFFIC INFRACTIONS AND TRAFFIC OFFENSES:

- a) An ordinance traffic infraction is a violation of any section of this ordinance that prescribes or requires the same behavior as that prescribed or required by a statutory revision that is classified as a traffic infraction in K.S.A. 8-2118.
- b) All traffic violations which are included within this ordinance, and which are not ordinance traffic infractions as defined in subsection (a) of this section, shall be considered traffic offenses.

Section 3 PENALTY FOR SCHEDULED FINES. The fine for violation of an ordinance traffic infraction or any other traffic offense for which the municipal judge established a fine in a fine schedule shall not be less than \$10 nor more than \$500. A person tried and convicted for violation of an ordinance traffic infraction or other traffic offense for which a fine has been established in a schedule of fines shall pay a fine fixed by the court not to exceed \$500.

#### Section 4 MAXIMUM SPEED LIMITS.

Section 33 of Article 7 of the Standard Traffic Ordinance for Kansas Cities, 2018 Edition, is hereby changed to read as follows: Section 33. Maximum Speed Limits

- a) Except when a special hazard exists that requires lower speed for compliance with Section 32, the limits specified in this section or established as hereinafter authorized shall be maximum lawful speeds, and no person shall drive a vehicle at a speed in excess of such maximum limits.
  - 1) Twenty (20) miles per hour in any business district;
  - 2) Twenty-five (25) miles per hour in any residential district;
  - 3) Twenty (20) miles per hour in school zones between the following hours during the school term on days school is in session: 7:30 a.m. to 8:30 a.m.; 11:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.; and 3:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. The following areas are school zones:
    - Eighth Street between Iowa and Bell Streets Granby Street between Fourth and Tenth Streets Fourth Street between Oak and Elm Streets Idaho Street between Sixth and Seward Streets Tank Street between Sixth and Seward Streets Ninth Street between Iowa and Lincoln Streets Church Street between Eighth and Tenth Streets
  - 4) Thirty (30) miles per hour on that portion of U.S. Highway 75 between Third Street and the Eastern City limits.
  - 5) Forty Five (45) miles per hour on that portion of U.S. Highway 75 from the Western City limits to 14<sup>th</sup>

Street.

- 6) Thirty (30) miles per hour on that portion of U.S. Highway 75 from 14<sup>th</sup> Street to 9th Street.
- 7) Thirty (30) miles per hour on that portion of the West half of Fourth Street between Tank and Fifth Streets.
- b) Unless otherwise directed by a police officer, the driver of any vehicle within the City Limits shall obey the instructions of all signs and other traffic control devices placed within the City Limits by the City of Neodesha. This requirement is subject to the exceptions granted to the driver of an authorized emergency vehicle in this ordinance.

<u>Section 5</u> ORDINANCES REPEALED. Ordinance No. 1676 and all or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

<u>Section 6</u> EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its publication in the official city newspaper.

#### **ORDINANCE NO. 1698**

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING PUBLIC OFFENSES WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF NEODESHA, KANSAS, INCORPORATING BY REFERENCE THE "UNIFORM PUBLIC OFFENSE CODE FOR KANSAS CITIES," EDITION OF 2018, WITH CERTAIN OMISSIONS, CHANGES AND ADDITIONS, PROVIDING CERTAIN PENALTIES AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 1677 AND ALL ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH.

# BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF NEODESHA, KANSAS:

Section 1 INCORPORATING UNIFORM PUBLIC OFFENSE CODE. There is hereby incorporated by reference for the purpose of regulating public offenses within the corporate limits of the City of Neodesha, Kansas that certain code known as the "Uniform Public Offense Code," Edition of 2018, prepared and published in book form by the League of Kansas Municipalities, Topeka, Kansas, save and except such articles, sections, parts or portions as are hereafter omitted, deleted, modified or changed. No fewer than three (3) copies of said Uniform Public Offense Code shall be marked or stamped "Official Copy as Adopted by Ordinance No. 1698", with all sections or portions thereof intended to be omitted or changed clearly marked to show any such omission or change and to which shall be attached a copy of this ordinance, and filed with the City Clerk to be open to inspection and available to the public at all reasonable business hours.

SECTION 10.13 AMENDED. Section 10.13 of Article 10 of the Uniform Public Offense Code, Edition of 2012, is hereby amended to read as follows:

10.13 BARBED WIRE AND ELECTRIC FENCES. It shall be unlawful for any person to construct, set up or maintain any barbed wire or above ground electric fence or enclosure within the City in any Residential Zone or Local Business Zone as shown on the Official City Zoning Map incorporated by Ordinance No. 1199.

Section 3 ORDINANCE REPEALED. Ordinance No. 1677 and all or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

<u>Section 4</u> EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its publication in the official city newspaper.
