A RESOLUTION FIXING A TIME AND PLACE AND PROVIDING FOR NOTICE OF A HEARING BEFORE THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF NEODESHA, KANSAS AT WHICH TIME THE OWNER, HIS AGENT, LIENHOLDERS OF RECORD AND OCCUPANTS OF THE STRUCTURE LOCATED AT 502 N 6th on LEGAL DESCRIPTION: THE NORTH 50 FEET OF LOT FORTY-SIX (46), RECOVERY OF FORD'S SUBDIVISION, CITY OF NEODESHA, WILSON COUNTY, KANSAS, MAY APPEAR AND SHOW CAUSE WHY SUCH STRUCTURE SHOULD NOT BE CONDEMNED AND ORDERED REPAIRED OR DEMOLISHED AS AN UNSAFE OR DANGEROUS STRUCTURE.

WHEREAS, Ed Truelove, the Enforcement Officer of the City of Neodesha, did on the 8th day of December, 2021, file with the Governing Body of said City a statement in writing that certain unoccupied structures hereinafter described are unsafe and dangerous; NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Governing Body of the City of Neodesha that a hearing will be held on the January 26, 2022 before the Governing Body of the City at 2:00 p.m. in the Commission Room at City Hall, 1407 N 8th Street, at which time the owner, his agent, any lien holder of record and any occupant of the structure located at 502 N 6th, Neodesha, Kansas may appear and show cause why such structure should not be condemned as an unsafe or dangerous structure and ordered repaired or demolished.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Clerk shall cause this Resolution to be published two consecutive times and shall give notice of the aforesaid hearing in the manner provided by law.

Commissioner Moffatt moved to adopt Resolution 21-37 setting a public hearing for January 26, 2022 as presented. Seconded by Commissioner Nichol. Motion carried.

Administrator Truelove addressed the Commission regarding the approval of an incubator lease agreement with the Neodesha Derrick News for the space located at 409 Main Street. Discussion held.

Commissioner Nichol moved to approve the incubator lease with the Neodesha Derrick News as presented. Seconded by Commissioner Moffatt. Motion carried.

Administrator Truelove addressed the Commission regarding accepting the resignation of a Planning & Zoning Committee member. This was originally planned after hiring the new Public Works Director in November. With the untimely resignation of this Public Works Director, the Governing Body is being asked to move forward to accept this resignation. Discussion held.

Administrator Truelove addressed the Commission to convene as the Neodesha Land Bank to consider a request to purchase property located at 1633 N 1st Street.

Commissioner Nichol moved to convene as the Neodesha Land Bank to consider the sale of property. Seconded by Commissioner Moffatt. Motion carried. Discussion held.

Commissioner Moffatt moved to approve the sale of 1633 N 1st Street to Jorge Cintron, at a sale price of \$2,500. Seconded by Commissioner Nichol. Motion carried.

Commissioner Nichol moved to adjourn as the Neodesha Land Bank. Seconded by Commissioner Moffatt. Motion carried.

Administrator Truelove addressed the Commission regarding a holiday bonus for all full-time and part-time employees. Discussion held.

Commissioner Moffatt moved to approve a holiday bonus of \$250 for all full-time and part-time employees. Seconded by Commissioner Nichol. Motion carried.




